1. Chairman's Welcome

Welcome everyone to the AGM.

This year has been a very special year for me in my role as Club Chairman, for so many reasons, but primarily because it has been the 10th anniversary of the Club.

Cumberland Netball Club was formed in 2000, by Rhiannon Hamilton (nee Leyshon) and started as a small group of friends (approximately 10) most of whom had played University netball together. I joined the Club in 2001 and since then I have seen the Club grow into one of the most successful clubs in London, an achievement I feel very privileged and proud to have been a part of.

Year on year our A teams have out-performed themselves, gaining promotion through the NLNL divisions until we won the League, gaining entry into and winning the County League, winning the invitation Poly League, winning both the County and Poly tournaments, and gaining promotion in consecutive years in the Regional League to find ourselves in the National Premier League! Wow, what an achievement in 10 years!

This success has been duplicated throughout the whole Club's teams, with some significant achievements, developments and improvements over the last 10 years, with many teams winning promotions in the local and County leagues. A special mention must go to the B team who this year won the County league and gained promotion into the Regional League.

I feel it is very fitting that in our 10th year the Club has become a Premier League Club, A Regional League Club, a County League Club and a local league Club – thank you and congratulations to all of you that have helped to achieve this success. I look forward to celebrating with you all properly at this year's special 10 year anniversary ball on 23rd July.

However, I'm not only proud of our competitive achievements, I am also proud of the community we've created. When you join Cumberland Netball Club you are not just buying a membership to play netball, you are buying a membership into an amazing Cumberland community that offers a huge variety of opportunities to you. This community offers life long friendships, personal and professional development, support and guidance, team work, travel, and a whole lot of fun and laughter.

George and I received a letter recently from Leanne (who sadly is leaving us this year to return home to Australia) which I would like to share with you all and is attached to my report. Her letter illustrates so clearly this Cumberland community, an achievement I feel is



actually greater than our competitive achievements.

Whilst we have achieved competitively and socially, we have however not done so well financially this year. We predicted last year that we may make a loss this year, and this predication came true, despite bringing in substantial amounts from sponsorship and fundraising. The treasurer's report to come will provide more details, however there are some hard financial decisions to be made this year (I apologise for sounding like the new government!).

And finally I would like to acknowledge and thank those members of the Club, who work tirelessly for the benefit of all the Club's members and without whom the success the Club has achieved would not exist. They work tirelessly both on the front line and behind the scenes, to develop players, to provide opportunities to all our players and volunteers, to ensure training and matches go ahead, to ensure the often complicated administration of the club is completed, to ensure we are promoting the Club and bringing in funding and sponsorship, to ensure we are solvent and financially secure, and to ensure we all play and compete in a safe and enjoyable environment.

You have all have spent considerable time studying, learning, practicing, planning, delivering and putting yourselves out there for the Club's benefit, and I'd like to acknowledge the Club's gratitude, appreciation and thanks.

Secondly thank you to the Committee, a group of outstanding volunteers, who donate their skills, expertise, hard work and commitment to the running of the Club and prove that our competitive and social achievements are well and truly matched by our administrative achievements. I would like to thank each and every one of you for your hard work.

Georgina Partridge (Club Secretary) - for all her tireless work as club secretary and the huge amounts of admin and responsibility that come with this role.

Kim North (Coaching and Umpiring Secretary) - not only does she coach and umpire herself but she has made a huge contribution to the co-ordination, recruitment and development of the coaching and umpiring teams at Cumberland

Rose McCarter, Elaine Thompson and Emma Clark - for assisting Kim in the umpiring role and organising all our umpires for all the leagues the teams compete in, an unenviable job.

Kirsty Smith and Andy Johnson (Club Development Officers) - for working so hard this year to maintain and develop our Silver Caps award and starting the work towards for next year's

I would like to also give particular and personal thanks to George who has been a brilliant secretary over the last few years, and has supported me massively in my role as Chair this season. To Joanne who has worked incredibly hard to bring our finances into check and to guide and help us through some difficult decisions (some still to come). There a small number of people standing down from their positions this year, mainly due to family or work commitments. **Sam, Rachel, and Rosie** your invaluable contributions shall be sorely missed, thank you again. And I would like to take this opportunity to encourage all members of the club to think about joining this excellent group of volunteers.

And finally, I'm almost there I promise, there are three special people I would like mention who are all leaving the Club this year.



Petra Keogh has been playing with the Club for almost as long as I have and has made a significant contribution to the success of the A team. She's seen the team through from those early NLNL and Acton League days right through to our current entry into the Premiership. Despite dabbling with Academy and Brunel Hurricanes she always returned to us, sometimes with a player or coach or two in tow. Petra is leaving us this year to live in Australia, and I shall be very sorry to see her go, we shall miss you in the A team, particularly in the Premier League and what a shame you couldn't stay for one more season to play with us on a National level. I wish you and your family lots of love and luck in your new life in Aus, keep in touch and keep on playing.

Krista Priscott and Leanne Bland, two fantastic coaches, who have had such a big impact on the Club and our teams over the last few years. Krista has been a fantastic player and more recently coach to the As, I know the whole team are gutted about your departure. Leanne, you have also been a great coach (and sometimes player) and I've seen lots of messages from S2 about what a difference you've made to them. I shall miss you both very much, and I know this is shared by many in the Club. Thank you so much for your contributions over the years you've been with us, we shall miss you very much and hope one day you will return to the Cumberland Community.

3. Treasurer's Report

The purpose of the club is to break even each year, with all funds being raised (from membership fees and fundraising) being fed back into the development of the club and its players. To do this however, the club needs to have a certain amount of ring fenced money to pay for affiliations, enter leagues and purchase equipment -in addition to purchasing kit which happens prior to payment being received from members.

Fees set last year were based on 176 members. Actual members including (including juniors and part year joiners etc) were around 127 - and hence the reason that costs were not covered.

Going forward, the club faces an exciting year in terms of progress and development but a tough year in terms of determining the future security of the club.

Increases in the court fees at Camden, the lack of secured sponsorship and the chance that league fees may not be funded means the club needs to set its fee level carefully.

I appreciate that this is a large increase on last year, however, it can be seen from this and last years results that the fees were subsidised by monies accumulated by the club in prior years and by donations from Des Grech. The proposed increase to the cost per member per week is £1.28 to ensure that the club continues as an entity, and continues to strive to achieve the best for it's players. In additional, in setting this level I have reviewed the fees of



other similar clubs such as Blaze, Hyde Park and Palmers Green (for which the information is available on their websites) and found that Cumberland is still at the lower end of this array.

As mentioned, the purpose of the club is not to make a profit - it is to ensure that there are enough funds to provide the coaching, facilities and equipment the club needs in order to develop the club and its members. If membership numbers increase and therefore the funds in the club increase - this will be fed back to the members as a benefit either through subsidise membership next year or through other club funded events in the year.

I would like to take this opportunity to stress to you all that we should be looking to all avenues to try to obtain external funding for the club - be it a new ball, a set of bibs or a cash donation - every little helps.

You will also see that the club has a large amount of stock at the year end - if you want to purchase any new kit, please speak to Lois and do this asap - and do your bit to free up some cash for the club.

In order to ensure we can provide the committee with the most up to date financial information, I would like to propose Becky Salmon is appointed as Assistant Treasurer and thank her for her interest in contributing her time to the club.

4. Secretaries' Reports

Club Secretary – Georgina Partridge

Yet another successful ,netballing ,year for Cumberland.

One of the great things about tonight is that everyone gets to hear about people that work hard for the club and their team, who perhaps might go under the radar. Starting from the top, as most of you will know the A's have been promoted again, this being the 3rd year running. Cumberland can now proudly say we are a National League Netball Club. We are looking forward to seeing what happens next season and whether a fourth year of promotion is on the cards. The Bs had a fantastic season and set themselves the target of winning Middlesex County League to secure a place in the Regional League playoffs. It's great when a plan comes together. I'm looking forward to hearing the targets for next season. The Cs now have the opportunity to be the new rising stars of North London and Middlesex next season.

Competition in the North London League and Middlesex was challenging, but we've had some excellent results. I had the pleasure of coaching the Ds, Es and Fs this season and have really seen some huge progress and success amongst the teams. The Ds and Es certainly had a bit of a stormer!

Much of today will be recognizing players and their achievements so I would like to use this spot to thank everyone on the committee. The committee meets up every six weeks or so to muse and discuss the new and topical issues at Cumberland HQ. Once the meeting is over the work begins, with netball admin taking over individuals spare time. There is a lot of



work done behind the scenes to make Cumberland run smoothly; to maintain our caps status, enter into all our leagues and divisions, affiliating members organize umpires and coaches and volunteers, manage our junior section, collect subs, make sure everyone is kitted out and importantly making sure that our netballing social lives are on track! A big thank you to all.

There are a couple of names I would personally like to mention for this season:

- Jo. There has been a lot of work done by Jo behind the scenes and delving into our financial situation. I wanted to thank you for being super efficient helping to manage a few issues recently.
- Andy & Kirsty. Who quietly get on with their committee role in an efficient and diligent way and provide important advice and experience on committee decisions.

On a final note

I have really noticed our relationships and interaction with leagues, umpires and other teams alike is extremely positive. It is testament to all of us that make up Cumberland and our positive and enthusiastic attitude to netball and each other.

Membership & Affiliation – Chaz Blythe

In the 2009/10 season our numbers of members has shrunk since last year, from 139 to around 93, mainly due to the fact that we are no longer running the development squad. We still have an active junior section, with more than 30 11-16 year-olds.

The related administration has run quite smoothly this season: membership forms and fees have come in from new members without the need for us to chase in too many cases, (in fact it's been more of a task chasing form from existing members!) and I'd like to remind everyone that we do need new membership forms filled in each season to ensure we have up to date contact and emergency contact information.

England Netball's affiliations process has been a mixed bag with their online system frequently crashing or locking us out having not registered our payments, however there have been assurances that there will be an improved system next season so I'm looking forward to less hassle there!

On league registrations, we've had an excellent season. Cumberland has 6 adult teams playing in 5 different leagues, and it's a true team effort between myself, coaches, umpiring secretaries and all of the captains to make sure we stay on the right side of their different rules for registering players, for play-ups, promotions, etc. Everyone has worked really hard with me this season, and I'd like to thank them for all their patience and prompt replies when I've been calling them up on Thursday afternoons before the weekend's registration deadlines! I am very proud to say that all this hard work has really paid off, and throughout the entire season (despite one close shave!) we haven't incurred a single penalty point in any of the leagues for our senior teams! And in Middlesex (where penalty points are



published) no other club with more than 1 team in the league (we have 4) has managed a clean sheet – so well done everyone. Let's replicate this next season.

Enquiries – Caroline Chilton

Enquiries have been down slightly on last year, with 253 emails received enquiring about joining our club since I took over in March, and 138 received since the season started in September. The newly introduced 'New Members Training sessions' have mostly been very successful (thanks Yvonne, George, Kim and Leanne for running them), although I think the final one of the season was only attended by 2 people. Not everyone attending has joined, but there are a number of players who joined mid-season who are now key members of many of our teams (and very much appreciated!).

The SPAM problems of last year have been minimal, although we have won a number of French Lotteries. I also keep receiving promotions inviting us to appear on reality TV shows.

Any other enquiries are generally passed on to higher authority (i.e. Kim) including the two messages received threatening to take the club to court (1 from a kit supplier and one from the Olympic 2012 committee). However, I believe all issues have now been resolved, so we can move into next season crisis-free!

Kit & Equipment – Lois Tucker

2009/2010 season saw the new exclusive Cumberland Kukri netball dresses rolled out to the A squad. The dresses are navy and white, racer back with Cumberland branding on the front and back.

The dresses have proved popular with the team and we've had a lot of positive comments about them. The kukri dress will be rolled out to the senior members of the club for the 2010/11 season.

This season also saw the introduction of the Cumberland hoodie which proved a popular alternative to the Gilbert tracksuit top and the Running Bare long sleeve tops which I know were appreciated in the colder months to wear under dresses.

New training aids were used including floor spots and tennis balls for fresh ideas reaction drills.

Next season we are looking in to more training balls and better storage for them, branded kit bags and other accessories. This will be dependent on deals and sponsorship as to ether we get subsidised prices.

Sponsorship – Karen Carter

It's been a fairly successful first year of securing additional funding for the club. Although we do not have an official sponsor in the traditional sense, we have received the following:



1. Over the season, we have received 2 incredibly generous personal donations from Des Grech, totalling £2,000. As a close friend, he is happy to support the growth and development of Cumberland and doesn't wish to appear as an official sponsor. Should we need this on a continual basis, Des is happy to donate a further £1,000 every 6 months to ensure we have sufficient funds as a club to continue to progress. Although nothing formal has been done to thank Des for his contribution and outward generosity, I would like to suggest that we thank him officially at the Black Tie Ball and present him with a small token of our gratitude and appreciation.
2. We ran a fundraising event in April this year which was a 'Comedy Night' in Camden. I would like to personally thank everyone who attended and particularly those who sold numerous tickets. I hope you all agree that it was a really fun night and we raised £450 as a result. Great work girls!
3. Running Bare (sports clothing brand) have continued their links with Cumberland this season and they have reconfirmed the following:
 - a. They have maintained a 10% discount across all of their clothing and product lines for all Cumberland members
 - b. They have kindly donated the prizes for the AGM this evening
 - c. They will be hosting a stand at the weekend of our trials in August to offer additional discounts across all products
 - d. They will not be able to offer actual funding this season and will re-address the situation at the end of the year
 - e. For further details, please refer to www.runningbare.co.uk
4. Additional events organised this season have included a winter and spring BMF session that ran at Hampstead Heath. They were great fun, yet exhausting(!) events and between 35-40 girls attended each session. BMF ran these closed events for us at a highly discounted rate and if anyone would like to officially join up as a member, we have a corporate discount through Cumberland Netball Club of £40 per month for unlimited attendance. Initial plans for next year include the following:

- Confirm meeting with The Cumberland Hotel based in Marble Arch to discuss official sponsorship opportunities. I have had an initial discussion with the Sales Manager and the Marketing Director and I now need to establish next steps.
- Run 2 more fundraising events similar to last year throughout the season to include another Comedy night and a day at the Races (other options are available). Both present us with an opportunity to raise circa £500 per event.
- Explore further links with the UCS Rugby Club. Joint events have taken place already this season and they are currently talking to the 'Walkabout' bars regarding official sponsorship and there is a potential opportunity to join forces with them.
- As discussed, Des Grech is happy to continue to provide his financial support should this be needed.



- Continue discussion with 'Sweaty Betty' for official funding. I did approach them at the start of this season but we lost momentum, so I need to pick this up again.
- Liaise closely with the new PR Secretary to establish what additional publicity may be possible this year in light of the clubs promotions into the National and Regional leagues (in order to make us an attractive prospect for potential organisations).

Finally, one request from me is to ask if anyone who has branding or marketing experience can support me initially over the next month or so to update the sponsorship pack again following all the changes this year. Payment of gratitude and Pinot is promised!!

Firstly because it's a great opportunity to raise much needed funds for the club and secondly because it's celebrating 10 years of Cumberland and its wonderful community. Youth – Eve Turner

I took up the role of youth representative in spring 2010. There have been some issues with attendance in the under 16 squad and we have already tried to do something about this. Rachel Urquart working with Chaz Blythe, Jane Spalding, Caroline Chilton, Carla Tanis (for half a season) and Nia (for a part of the season) have guided the U14s and U16s to enjoyable games in the north London league. Cumberland is lucky to have has an extremely promising group of under 12s who have been competing in the under 14 league where sometimes the height differential is the only difference between the teams.
